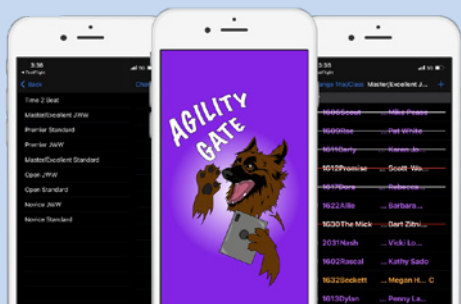

Agility Gate is a free-to-download app that allows competitors to check-in their dogs via their mobile phone or tablet at an agility show and keep track of the current state of the run orders. It helps prevent crowding around the gate and allows competitors to keep tabs on things while crating away from the ring or away from the show site.

Arrival/Setup

There will be no early exhibitor setup on Thursday, January 23, except for volunteers helping to **unload the trailer at 2 PM**. You may set up on Thursday **ONLY IF** you help unload the trailer. We can always use help! Thank you!

The building opens at 6:30 AM all three days.

DOGS MAY NOT BE LEFT AT THE SHOW SITE OVERNIGHT.

Crating and Parking

- No crating on concrete around the ring.
- Main crating will be in the smaller dirt arena behind the main arena.
- Limited crating will be available on the dirt next to the AKC ring.
- 10x10 stalls available to rent \$25/day. For reservations, call 903-287-9501.
- PLEASE PARK SMART ... Parking is on dirt. There are no lines. Please park straight and in rows to leave plenty of room for everyone.
- The first row of parking is reserved for people crating out of the car.

Measuring

All agility dogs are required to have an Official Jump Height Card and must be able to present it if asked. Don't forget to bring your height card in case someone asks for it.

Neither judge is a Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO). Unless an AKC Rep is present (not expected), there will not be a Measuring Official at this trial. Measurements will not be official -- it is only to make sure you are in the correct jump height for this weekend. All exhibitors who do not have a permanent height card or temporary (yellow) measurement form must be measured before running (unless you're jumping 24"). Measurements will be taken all day between classes. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running.

Concessions

A taco food truck will be on site all three days for lunch. There are also lots of restaurant options nearby.

Running Orders and Course Maps

The preliminary run orders will be posted on imagilityservices.com 3-4 days prior to the first day of the trial.

Course maps will be posted at the trial site per AKC Agility Regulations. Please take picture of the posted maps for access on your phone or tablet. Maps will also be posted on the Agility Gate App.

VERY, VERY IMPORTANT!

Every competitor is required to fill out the **LONGHORN ARENA AND EVENT CENTER ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK** form on **pages 9 & 10** of this judging program. It is **MANDATORY** for **every competitor**. There will be a turn-in basket for the completed forms. Extra forms will be available if needed.

ISC Cup Reminders

- To be eligible for the overall ISC Texas Hold 'Em Cup podium awards, you must be entered in **all four** ISC rounds on Saturday.
- Runs will be scored time plus faults. All faults are 5 secs and elimination is 100 secs.
- The top 3 combined winners per height will be on the podium and receive prizes.
- **PRIZES FOR ISC CUP (SATURDAY):** Dogs placing in the top 3 in each jump height will be awarded a dog toy valued at less than \$5. Runs will be scored time plus faults. All faults are 5 secs and eliminations are 100 secs. The top 3 combined winners per height will be on the podium and receive prizes. Preferred Dogs will be judged within their regular jump height.

ISC World Team Qualifying Event Reminders

- Combined scores from the ISC **A3 Agility** and **J3 Jumpers** on Saturday, will be used to award the Combined ISC Class Award and the World Team Tryouts Bye.
- To be eligible for the Combined ISC Class Award the team must have a minimum of one clean ISC run and a run that has a maximum of 5 course faults (no time faults allowed) for those scores to be used to compute the Combined Score.
- If the winning dog in any given jump height does not meet the FCI jump heights, the award DOES NOT go to the first eligible dog. If no FCI-eligible dog meets the requirements for Combined Class Award, the Bye award is not given.
- The Combined Class winners that meet the FCI jump height cut offs from the 12-, 16-, 20- and 24-inch heights are invited to attend the AKC/USA World Team Tryouts. They do not need to fulfill any other performance requirements.
- The handler at tryouts must be the same handler that won the Combined Award
- **PRIZES FOR ISC CLASSES:** First Place: Rose Rosette; Second Place: Brown Rosette; Third Place: Light Green Rosette; Fourth Place: Gray Rosette.

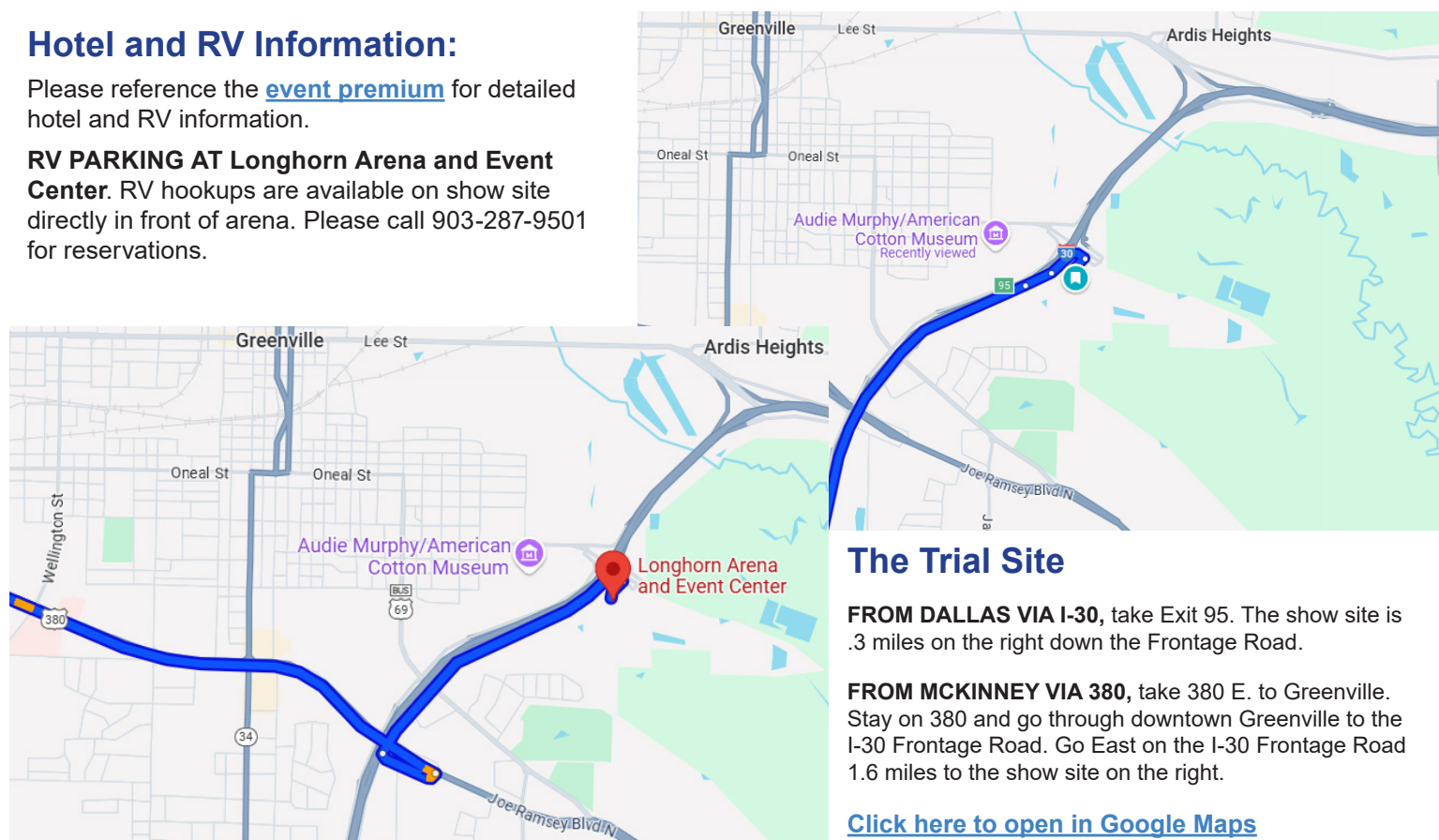

I am of lawful age, do understand, authorize, consent, and can substantiate the following:

1. **CREDENTIALS:** In Stride Chiropractic is comprised of Doctors of Chiropractic licensed in human care. Employees / contractors of In Stride Chiropractic have completed postgraduate work in order to become certified by the American Veterinary Chiropractic Association / International Veterinary Chiropractic Association in order to safely and effectively practice on animals.
2. **SCOPE:** The employees / contractors of In Stride Chiropractic are not veterinarians and they do not intend to replace traditional vet care or take responsibility for my animal's primary healthcare needs. I am seeking chiropractic and/or rehabilitation for my animal(s) as a complementary means to be used concurrently with my current veterinary care. Texas Law states: "Animal Chiropractic and other forms of musculoskeletal manipulation are systems of therapeutic application of mechanical forces applied manually through the hands or any mechanical device to diagnose, treat and or alleviate impaired or altered function of related components of the musculoskeletal system of non-human animals. Chiropractic...[is] considered to be [an] alternate therap[y] in the practice of veterinary medicine." **22 Tex Admin Code § 573.14.** Our care does NOT include: dispensing/injecting medication, performing surgery, recommending supplements, or providing any traditional veterinary care.
3. **SUPERVISION:** Texas law states: "Alternate therapies, including ultrasound diagnosis and therapy, magnetic field therapy, holistic medicine, homeopathy, chiropractic treatment, acupuncture, and laser therapy, are performed only by a veterinarian or under the supervision of a veterinarian" **Sec. 801. 151** It is therefore recommended that, in states where the practice act permits, a chiropractor working on animals perform all services with SUPERVISION from a licensed veterinarian providing concurrent care.
4. **RECORD SHARING:** I hereby allow In Stride Chiropractic and my referring vet to share any and all records so they can better collaborate on my animal's treatment. I allow In Stride Chiropractic to share records with any and all members of my animal care team (i.e: trainers, massage therapists, groomers, etc). I hereby also allow use of my pet's health information for research purposes.

LIABILITY RELEASE: UNDER TEXAS LAW (CHAPTER 87, CIVIL PRACTICE AND REMEDIES CODE), A FARM ANIMAL PROFESSIONAL OR FARM OWNER OR LESSEE IS NOT LIABLE FOR AN INJURY TO OR THE DEATH OF A PARTICIPANT IN FARM ANIMAL ACTIVITIES, INCLUDING AN EMPLOYEE OR INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR, RESULTING FROM THE INHERENT RISKS OF FARM ANIMAL ACTIVITIES.

Riders must provide their own protective gear.**

LAEC SAFETY GUIDELINES

All equine and animal programs emphasize creativity and responsiveness in relating to such animals. The LAEC stresses safety rules. Anyone who knowingly or maliciously breaks these rules is a safety risk for the entire group and, as such, will not be allowed to participate in the program. Horses and other animals can be startled into a flight or fight mode. The following guidelines may prevent serious mishaps and make the experience more enjoyable for everyone involved, including the horses.

1. Do not touch or feed horses and other animals you have not been introduced to.
2. When holding the lead rope, never wrap it around your hand, or lay it over your neck or shoulder.
3. Avoid standing directly in front of or directly behind a horse or other animals. When going around behind the horse, put your hand on the horse's hindquarters and keep your body very close to his body. This allows the horse to know where you are. A person who cannot easily reach the top of the hindquarters should always ask for assistance in walking around the horse. When two people are working with the same horse, they should stand on the same side of the horse.
4. Do not hit the horse or other animals. Physical violence only escalates the animal's impulses.
5. If the instructor calls a "Time Out," stop what you are doing, step away from your horse or animal or return to the neutral leading position and wait for further instructions.
6. If an animal begins to panic, give him some space. Do not try to restrain him. If the situation escalates, LET THE ANIMAL GO! Call "Time Out", "Loose Horse!" or "Loose Animal!"
7. Horses are very sensitive to the feelings of their herd members as well as the human beings who interact with them. Feelings are a primary source of information to this species. Pay attention to your feelings and how these feelings are changing. If you get frustrated, fearful, or angry, call your own "Time Out" and reassess the situation. Do not hesitate to ask for help.
8. Do not hold your breath. Horses give and receive information through the quality and frequency of their breathing. Holding your breath or producing quick, shallow breaths convey feelings of stress and fear to the horses and can cause them to become stressed or fearful.

I have read these LAEC Safety Guidelines and will watch the accompanying demonstration. I agree to follow these rules and ask for help if I am having trouble with any of the activities. I agree to be responsible for my own safety and thus contribute to the safety of the group.
